- Fundraising:** Raise money for HPA from foundations, corporations, and individuals.
- Membership development:** Expand HPA membership and recruit volunteers.
- Property advocacy:** Organize advocacy for preservation of particular buildings or streetscapes.
- Public relations and communications:** Edit and put out a quarterly newsletter; maintain the HPA web site; coordinate public relations campaigns.
- Public policy:** Advocate for changes in local ordinances, city policies, and state laws so as to promote preservation.
- Neighborhood relations:** Work with neighborhood revitalization committees (NRZs) and other neighborhood groups to help revitalize city neighborhoods through preservation rather than demolition.
- Education:** Coordinate walking tours, organize forums and workshops.
- Property surveys and cataloguing:** Survey architecturally significant neighborhoods; help prepare applications for the State and National Register of Historic Places.
- Technical assistance:** Recruit architects, structural engineers, lawyers, and other professionals willing to provide pro bono services to promote preservation.
- Resource development:** Identify government and private-sector financial resources for building renovation and neighborhood revitalization; find contractors willing to renovate endangered buildings inexpensively.
- Recycling of architectural materials:** Establish a facility or develop a relationship with a company to store and recycle architecturally significant building elements and materials (e.g., from demolished buildings).
- Other preservation activities in which you would like to be an active participant:
